#### THE PREPARATION

O Lord, open our lips; and our mouth shall proclaim your praise. Pour your love into our hearts, O God, through the Holy Spirit you have given to us.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, As it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.

Either this or another Epiphany HYMN may be recited or sung The second verse is for the Morning, the third for the Evening

Blessed are you, Sovereign God, King of the nations, to you be praise and glory for ever. From the rising of the sun to its setting your name is proclaimed in all the world.

As the Sun of righteousness dawns in our hearts, anoint our lips with the seal of your Spirit that we may witness to your gospel and sing your praise in all the world, Father, Son and Holy Spirit: **Blessed be God for ever.** 

You gave the Christ as a light to the nations, and through the anointing of his Spirit you established us as a royal priesthood. As you call us into his marvellous light, may our lives bear witness to your truth and our lips never cease to proclaim your praise, Father, Son and Holy Spirit: **Blessed be God for ever.** 

#### THE WORD OF GOD

## THE PSALM(S):

### THE SCRIPTURE READING(S):

The reading(s) for the day will also be found in the weekly Pew Sheet. Use one or both readings depending on the time available to you.

Silence may be kept after the reading(s) followed by This Response The Word of Life which was from the beginning, **We proclaim to you.** 

THE GOSPEL CANTICLE: The Benedictus (morning)

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel. for he has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of his servant, David. Through his holy prophets he promised of old, that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all that hate us. He promised to show mercy to our forebears and to remember his holy covenant. This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham, to set us free from the hands of our enemies. Free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight, all the days of our life. You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the most high, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, To give his people knowledge of salvation, by the forgiveness of all their sins. In the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death. and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.

The Magnificat (afternoon or evening)

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour. For he has looked with favour on his lowly servant, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed. The Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant, Israel, for he has remembered his promise of mercy. The promise he made to our forebears, to Abraham and his seed for ever. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.

Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new; transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory: through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord who is alive and reigns with you...... Amen.
